About our Program

We are a full-time commercial Taxidermy Studio located in Pensacola Florida doing services for the public and conducting over 40-50 courses and workshops per year under the Taxidermy Tech program. We conduct mostly Basic Beginner Courses but we do run Intermediate and Advance Training Courses as required.

We have students that attend from all corners of the United States and International locations. The program speaks for itself. We do not exaggerate it into something it is not. The students who have attended do a much better job than we do of articulating the true benefits of attending through their testimonials.

First off you have to understand that there is no courses or workshop that is going to make you an expert. That is not our claim or that of anyone else that we know of that offers training professionally. To be considered an expert you are going to need a lot of experience and that is going to come if you put in the time. The same passion that motivates you to attend a formal course is the same passion that inspires you to put it all into practice when you get home. We can lead you to the right path but it is ultimately up to you to follow it.

Specimens are actually fairly easy to acquire if you do not have your own but there could be some expense involved. We can provide them but we will have to recoup our costs which will be billed to you prior to arrival. Deer capes and/or antlers is usually in the range of about \$200 for 2 specimens. Turkeys, Bobcats and other small predators are usually around \$175 each. Waterfowl can not be sold but we can usually provide if necessary... however, we depend entirely on donated specimens for training. If you do have some, please bring them and pay it forward for the next student.

For a 5 day one-on-one Basic Whitetail deer course the rate is \$2425 which is the Materials and Training. A sample schedule under our payment plan is as follows:

Payment #1 Due on enrollment \$606.00 (Enrollees have 72 hours to make payment. We can not hold unsecured slots.

Payment #2 Due 14 days from start \$1212.00

Payment #3 Due Last Business Day prior to training \$606.00

If specimens are required they are either added to the initial invoice or paid on arrival.

If you can not attend on your scheduled dates we will work with you to reschedule at a later date.

We are located in Pensacola Florida.

Specimens- If you have your own specimens, ie deer capes and antlers then that it is obviously not an additional expense. Specimens can be acquired and are sometimes donated. For the Deer course , capes and horns but not a significant expense. With the new Chronic Wasting Disease changes, we will have to make a determination on booking whether or not you can bring your own specimens. For the small waterfowl course we prefer you provide your own ducks but we can usually provide them free of charge. Wild birds are strictly regulated under the Federal Migratory Bird Act. Pen Raised Birds with Papers can be purchased. Most other specimens we can acquire at below market prices but if you are not providing your own specimens then it will be an additional expense, although not usually a significant one for the most common of species. Occasionally we have specimens donated.

Lodging- Lodging is the responsibility of the student. We no longer book lodging, however, we strongly recommend AirBnB or VRBO. Most of our students find lower rates and better more private accommodations from full houses to tiny houses to spare rooms.

Your Training Environment

Our primary work space is a 3000 SF warehouse located in a very busy commercial/industrial section of Northwest Pensacola. We have a student cubicle in the west side of the warehouse. There is a handicap equipped bathroom in the office. We have a 60-inch flat screen television in the office, another in the cubicle for reference and a computer available for use and wireless internet throughout the building.

We have a refrigerator, microwave, smoker, crockpot, Keurig and a regular coffee pot on site and keep the refrigerator well stocked with water, sodas, tea, sandwich food and snacks. Please make yourself at home...everything there is for you.

Decisions

Once you decide that you would like to attend you will need to select dates. You can check our calendar under resources on the Taxidermy Tech website for availability. Keep in mind our calendar is meant to represent what is booked by name and course. It does not necessarily reflect what is available. A good rule of thumb is this...if you see 2 other scheduled courses during the week you select it is probably a full week. We have 3 instructors here in Pensacola but we try to only commit two at a time at the most. Our Ashville location is not currently accepting students. Send your requested dates to ken@citizensportsman.com. We can set up a time to talk if we have not already to determine the requirement for lodging and specimens. We will deconflict your dates with our schedule and get you booked. We book up to 12 months out.

Once the dates have been selected we will send you an Enrollment Packet via email. Everything you need to make a decision and get formally enrolled is in that email enrollment packet. Once you have reviewed and agreed to the proposal via email you can go to your invoice via our secure payment processing system and make your payment. You may pay in full, in part, or use the payment schedule we have provided. The payment schedule is a courtesy to help you break down your course costs into smaller more manageable parts.

If you use a payment option your first payment is due on enrollment. Your dates are not secured until that payment is made. You have 72 hours to make your enrollment payment. At that point your dates are available to other parties for booking. We have a high demand for dates so please be on time with your payments.

Second payment is due not later than 30 days from the start of your course.

The final payment is due by the last business day prior to the start of your course.

Pre-arrival

We know everyone is excited to get started and that enthusiasm may lead you to show up 30 minutes to an hour or more early but please try not to be too early...10 minutes or so is perfect. We ask everyone to please honor that request. This is also a Taxidermy studio so every morning (especially Monday) has the potential to be hectic. Monday morning is always key in getting my guys oriented on what they have to focus on during the week. We open at 9 AM Central time.

You will meet Christopher, Chloe, Hannah, Megan, Erista and Skylair while you're here... We are very much a family here at the shop and there is good chemistry...we pick at each other a lot but it is all in fun!

The address is 8929 Pensacola Blvd. We are in the InstaLoan complex directly across the street from Walmart and the Walmart Murphy's gas station. You can look for the big green and yellow InstaLoan sign and you should see our sign underneath...pull down into that complex all the way to the back right and you will see us.

We do have lunch here every day. We are more and more health conscious about what we are putting in to our bodies so salad is an everyday thing for us. We keep a lot of rabbit foods here to put together salads to include protein so if you like that kind of thing you will be in good company! We also have sandwich meat and cheese so if you prefer sandwiches it will be here and available for you. At least once or twice a week we will pressure pot some lean meat like pork loin or chicken breast. We have pretty much stopped ordering in pizza and other fast foods as it does not conform well to our health goals 😊 ! But there is always food and snacks and plenty of drinks from water and Gatorade to sodas and coffee. You are welcome to go offsite for lunch or bring your own if you prefer but you are certainly invited to eat with us. We try to all stop together and eat together every day, usually around 1230 PM for around 30 minutes.

Terms

Payment Schedule

The payment schedule is \$100 -25% - 50% - 25%.

1. Your first full payment of 25% of the total course fee balance is due on enrollment. If your preferred dates are already inside that window and we have confirmed availability, your first payment is due immediately. Once you are inside the 60 day window the payment is non-refundable and non-negotiable. This is to protect our interests in the event of cancellation. Scheduling a student for a course reserves a slot that we may not be able to fill in the event of a late cancellation which can be costly. We will always work with you to reschedule as required.
2. Your second payment of 50% of the total course fee balance is due not later than 30 days prior to the start of your resident training. At this time we will confirm and order any required specimens and materials. Please do not be late with your second payment. Material and specimen orders are time sensitive. If you see that you are going to be late, call us immediately.
3. The remaining balance due will be due on the last business day prior to the start of training. **YOU MUST BE PAID IN FULL PRIOR TO STARTING YOUR COURSE.**
4. Cancellations within 30 days from the start of the session will result in a refund less the booking deposit/first payment. All cancellations must be in writing before refund will be issued. Refunds will be issued less expenses by company check within 2-4 weeks. Many acts of God, Nature (and employer) are out of your hands and ours. We will work with you to reschedule your training should the need arise.
5. We will not be held responsible for injury or illness during the conduct of the workshop on or off the premises where the training is conducted. We do have a medical waiver and will ask you to disclose any serious medical issues at the time of enrollment.
6. Invoices accept most major credit cards, debit cards and bank transfer. Bank transfers through the invoice are preferred and there is no service fee. Debit or credit card transactions will include a 2.9% processing fee that we pay to our processors. There will be a \$35 fee assessed on all returned checks. We do not accept Money Orders. Personal checks paid for booking deposits must clear before your time is locked and must be received according to the published payment schedule.

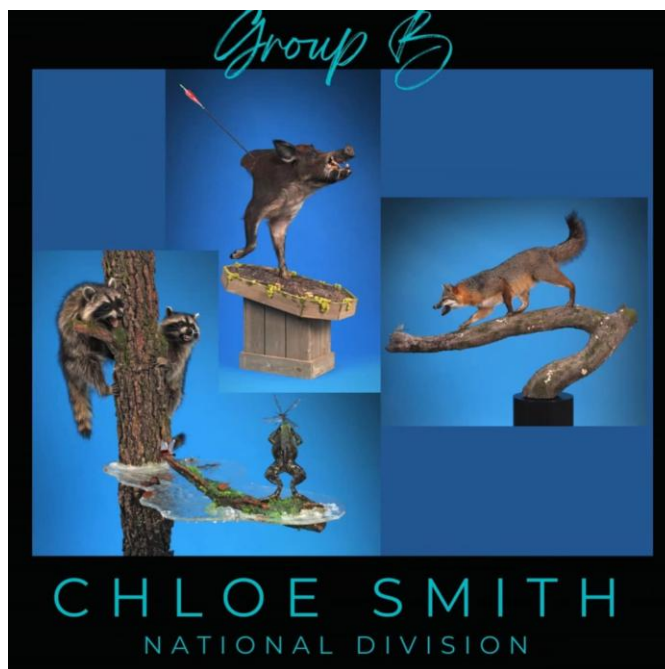
We have a high demand for training dates and limited training dates available so please confirm receipt and acceptance as soon as possible. Failure to do so may result in a loss of your slot.

Here are a few points to keep in mind before, during and after your time with us

Clear your mind of any distractions.

Take good notes, pictures and anything else you can to reference later. Feel free to record audio, video or photograph any portion of the training; in fact, we encourage it if at all possible. This is your time...you own it. Take possession of it.

Stick with the process. It may not look like it is coming together at times when your executing the steps... but it will.

Trust your abilities. No matter what it is or how bad it looks, you can fix it.

When you leave, your focus should be jumping on that next mount as soon as possible to lock in everything you learned under your instructor. This cannot be emphasized enough.

Call...often. Check in and let us know how you are doing and what we can do to help you. Do not be afraid to call and ask for assistance on a problem.

Don't stop learning. If you follow our recommendations and get to work as quickly as possible, you will get better and better...But no matter how good you get, how much your business grows or how many awards you win, you must never view yourself as the final authority on anything.

Pray for challenges. They are a good test of your skills and are the best experiences you could hope for.

Effective Training (From our Taxidermy Tech Fall 2015 Newsletter)

An effective training program must be more than a testimony or a personal success story of the instructor(s). Being good at something does not necessarily mean you will be good at teaching it just as being a good teacher does not require a greater knowledge of a subject than everyone else on the planet. It does not hinge on perfect public speaking skills, graduate degrees or how many awards or trophies you have. Those are all good tools and certainly contributors to my own successes... but they are not the defining characteristics that make someone an effective instructor and under no circumstances are they the sole factors to consider in choosing a training program. In nearly 30 years in education and training from the Army to the Government and Private sectors, my perspective of "effective training" has evolved considerably.

First, there is no one-size-fits-all in training. As an instructor, you have to get out of the mindset of how you teach and into the mindset of understanding how your student learns. This alone has made me a better, more attentive instructor.

Second is establishing a training focus of important aspects of the training and evolving it as you assess strengths and weaknesses. There is a lot of good-to-know information out there and it has a place but keep your priorities centered on the must-know information and let it evolve from there.

The third principle focuses on practical application. Practice makes perfect right? Wrong. There is some flexibility in methods and techniques but incorrect applications of the fundamentals in practice will yield incorrect and inconsistent results. Only perfect practice makes perfect.

The fourth principle is based on my belief that our role in the student's professional development continues to be relevant when he/she leaves our physical premises through continued support, guidance and mentorship. The intent here is to provide a solid professional and technical foundation and the motivation and encouragement needed to grow and cultivate their skills and confidence.
